The rising deaths of infant due to poorer maternity health care centers, still persisting issues of child health, child rising, child rights & child marriage, food, mal nutrition & health issue such as lack of medical infrastructure, of qualified medical lack functionaries, and non-access to basic medicines etc. Besides there problems of increasing are maternity deaths, deaths of girl children below 1-5 year, complete absence of pure drinking water facilities. complete nonexistence of sanitation absolute absence of hygiene, complete deficiency of medical care units, absence of healthy practices & medical care knowledge etc

Considerations: Community libraries are facing following problems provision of light, spacious hall for readers, book stocks for different groups, local unemployment, support to local business, innovation.

- 1. Government does not have any initiative to meet the information needs of the rural women.
- 2. As most of the people of live in rural parts, government should collect data for rural and urban area separately, so that the actual scenario of the rural women can be revealed.
- 3. In order to empower rural women, awareness of information



needs and information sources should be created among them.

- 4. In addition to establish libraries or information centers in the communities for the development of knowledge base of Information the women. Communication **Technologies** should be introduced to them, so that they can use the modern technologies to meet information needs. (Report of the National Commission of Child Rights in India 2013).
- 5. Community libraries can also be established along with schools and colleges which will provide the necessary information for the individual development of the rural women as well as their family.
